I tribute lymge and beryge in Chelveton otherwise Chelton aforesaid
 (excepting my Olof called the Parke meadowes lying in Chelveton
 otherwise Chelton aforesaid) To hold to him and his heires from
 and after the decease of Anne Beame my mother upon Condition
 notwithstanding that he the said Anthony my said Sonne had a
 heires exorsors or administrators shall pay or cause to be paid
 to Joseph Shaddelowe my Sonne the summe of one hundred
 poundes of lawfull money of England when he the said Joseph
 shall attaine to his age of one and twentie yeares at or in Church
 porch of the parische Church of Chelveton otherwise Chelton
 aforesaid in discharge and payment of one hundred poundes wch
 I stand bound to pay by my obligacion to the said Joseph when he
 shall attaine to his age of one and twentie yeares or in and by the
 said obligacion and Condition thereof to which for more certainty
 I myselfe it doth and may appere by the said Joseph
 then deliveringe out the said obligacion to the said Anthony my
 said Sonne to be cancelled And alsoe he the said Anthony my
 said Sonne paynige unto Daniell Shaddelowe my third Sonne the
 summe of two hundred poundes of lawfull money of England when
 he the said Daniell shall attaine to his age of one and twentie
 yeares at or in the Church porch aforesaid Provided alwaies
 and my minde and will is that if the said Anthony my said Sonne
 shall faile and make default in payment of the said one hundred
 poundes before devised to the said Joseph or of the said two
 hundred poundes before devised to the said Daniell at any of the
 dayes and tymes wherin the same are devised to be paid as
 aforesaid, that then and therafter it shall and may be lawfull
 to and for him or them the said Joseph and Daniell that shall not
 be paid in manner and forme as aforesaid to enter upon my
 Olof called the bridge Olof and my meadowes lymge
 aforesaid and them to have hold occupie and enjoye until he
 or they be fullie satisfied and paid his or their respective
 legacies in manner and forme as aforesaid And alsoe I give
 and bequeath my said Sonne Joseph All my landes Tenementes
 and hereditamentes situate lymge and beryge in Wilby and
 Worthingworth and either of them in the County of Suff To
 have and to hold to the said Joseph and his heires from and
 after the decease of Anne my wife And alsoe I give and
 devise to Daniell my said Sonne my said Olof called the
 Parke meadowes To hold to him and his heires for ever to
 and after the decease of Anne my wife when he shall attaine to his said age of one
 and twentie yeares Provided alwaies and my minde and
 will is that my Exorsors hereafter named shall have and
 receive all the rents and profits of all my landes Tenementes
 and hereditamentes to my said Sonne as aforesaid until they
 shall attaine to their respective ages of one and Twentie yeares
 not countinge or sufferinge to be counted any delay or waite
 upon the said landes and premises for and towards the bringing
 upp and Education maintenance and bringinge forth of my said
 Sonne Alwaies provided and my will and meaninge is that
 Anne my wife shall have the lymge and beryge wch
 my said Sonne Daniell shall be of a poynt of age to put
 forth to lymge or fishinge to be bound forth to trades And
 my will and meaninge is that my Exorsors shall allowe

pay unto Anne my wife for their keeping a reasonable and sufficient allowance And the Overplus of the rents issues & profits that shall arise and come of my lands and tenements & hereditaments to my said Sonnes as aforesaid I will that my Executors shall equally divide betwene and amongst my said Sonnes when they shall attaine to their severall ages of one and twenty yeares And also I devise all my goods and chattells to my Executors to be sold And all my bondes bills and debts owing me and all my readie money to them therewithall to pay my debts my funerall expences and the probate of this my last will and Testament And the Overplus of all my said goods and chattells readie money and debts owing me after my debts & legacies paid funerall expences discharged, and also the probate of this my last will and Testament I give and bequeath unto Anne my wife And I do make and ordaine my wellbelov'd friends John Lamb of Bramford and Edward Clarke of Waghbrooke in the County of Suff. gent my Executors of this my last will and Testament Also I give and devise to my son Thomas Shardelowe of Winfarthinge in the County of North gent forty shillings to buy him a Ring withall And lastly I give unto my said Executors to either of them five poundes for their payme and paise to be taken in and about the execution of this my will and Testament desiringe them to be careful to see my debts truly paid and that my children may be well educated and their estates preserved in husbandly manner In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand & Seale the day and yeare aforesaid Anthony Shardelowe Seal'd subscribed and published in the presence of Thomas Shardelowe Mary Gates the mark of Anne Tyler Robert Warner

A Codicill and postscript to

be annexed to my last will and Testament bearing date the thirteenth day of November 1657 as followeth

Item my will and purpouses That my Executors before named shall have full power and authority in as full and ample manner as I the said Anthony Shardelowe now have to aliene sell or otherwise dispose of certain lands lying in Miffeld or any other villiage or Towne adiacent notwithstanding any gift or former devise in this my said will notwithstanding this is annexed) unto Anthony my Sonne which money I dispose as followeth first I will that my debts be paid and other expences and charges be discharged and the Overplus of the said money be employed and divided betwene my three Sonnes Anthony Joseph and Daniell To Anthony one moiety, and the other moiety to be equally divided betwene Joseph and Daniell when they shall arriveth and be of the full age of one and twenty yeares The names and contents of the lands to be sold are as followeth Inprimis one acre or thereabouts lately parted with a ditch of the Trenchment Belonging to the Miffeld wood ground on the part of the East and other landes of the said Anthony called Church on the part of the West and abut both upon the lands late and being

towards the South, and the landes of the said Anthony called Dancour
 towards the North and southerne by estimation five acres more or lesse
 and hold by Coppie of the manor of Mettfield. Item one pightill
 of the Courtment Belant lymge betwene the landes late John Barre
 Dure in Gernye on both party, the South head abuteth upon Mett-
 wood greene, and the North upon the Copiehold landes of the manor
 of Mettfield aforesaid southerne one acre more or lesse. Item one
 pightill called Dancour lymge betwene the pightill first specified, and
 southerne by estimation five acres more or lesse freehold. Item one
 pightill called Thurd southerne by estimation five acres more
 or lesse and holdeth by Coppie of Walsgham Hall. Item
 one meadowe sometime a grove adioynge upon the pightill last
 specified and southerne by estimation five acres holdeth by Coppie
 of Walsgham Hall. Item one other meadowe sometime a wood
 surrounded with hirkewood greene and southerne by estimation
 five acres more or lesse and is freehold. And my further will and
 meaning is that if Anne my beloved wife shall release her right
 of Joynture with the landes mentioned in this Goddill
 writ or any part thereof then I give and bequeath unto the said
 Anne my wife in hewe thereof all those my landes called Rookes
 with a grove therunto belonginge by estimation in Mettfield aforesaid
 for and duringe the terme of her naturall life any thinge in my said
 will southerne to the contrary in any wise notwithstandinge
 withynge wherof I have to this Goddill written and my hand
 and seale the sixteenth of June 1656. Anthony Shardelowe

 Anthony Shardelowe in the presence of Mr William Sanders

 the probate of wills and grantinge administration lawfully authorized
 the seventeenth day of January in the year of our Lord God

 thousand six hundred fiftie six by the oath of John Lambard
 Edward Clarke Executors named in the last will and testament
 of the said deceased to whom was committed administration
 they beinge by vertue of a Commission first legally sworn
 truly and faithfully to administer.
